# **Community Life Activator**

Helen Hoogstad has been hired as the Evesham Community Life Activator. Starting this fall, Helena will be tasked with creating avenues whereby Evesham Community Church could connect with people of all ages and stages principally through three methods: making invitations to Sunday services and events, organizing and coordinating events, and making personal visits.

### **Window and Ramp Repairs Report**

In early July contractor Eugene Knorr began work on the church windows. He removed the old single pane basement windows and replaced them with double glaze windows. New concrete sills were poured so the bottoms of the windows are well above ground level. Volunteers removed the church storm windows so Eugene could realign the top window sashes. Once this job was successfully completed, volunteers varnished the interior sills and window frames. The window frames looked so nice with the new coat of varnish that they proceeded to varnish the floor as well. After discussion with church members, Eugene was asked to rebuild the outside ramp at the church. On his recommendation, decking boards were used which will provide a non-slip, long-lasting surface with no other covering required. We were most fortunate to have such a conscientious contractor, who understands and appreciates the building materials in our 90 year old church, do this work for us.

#### **News from VBS**

Macklin Vacation Bible School was held August 19 - 23 with opening sessions each morning at Grace United Church. The theme this year was "Our Awesome God" – journeying with Moses on an awesome adventure. Through Bible stories about Moses' life, from a baby in a basket to the leader of God's people, the children learned that our awesome God has awesome power, care, trust, love and an awesome plan for each one of us.
